1	<p>Shot 1A: Hills Panoramic w/ Title Shot 1B: Still picture of Daniel Boone fade horizon to river Shot 1C: Walking Shot 1D: River panoramic</p>	<p>Shot 1A: (Intro Music “Cat Briar Road” fade to background) Shot 1B: (Narrator) Early in the 19th century, American folk hero Daniel Boone was returning from Kentucky in an effort to secure settlers for the unbroken territory around the Meramec River in East Central Missouri. Shot 1C: (Narrator) He was accompanied on his journey by Stephen and Dorcas Sullivan. Shot 1D: (Narrator) Upon entering the area now known as the Meramec State Park, Boone remarked, "Sullivan, this is the region that I was telling you about. In these hills you will find copper, lead and game in abundance."</p>	Shoot scenes 1, 5, 6 together
2	<p>Shot 2A: Post office Shot 2B: RailroadDepot.jpg transition to modern train. Shot 2C: MainStreet1800s.jpg</p>	<p>Shot 2A: (Narrator) The settlement was officially founded with the arrival of a U.S. Post Office in 1856. Shot 2B: (Narrator) A town was laid out when the railroad finally reached the area in 1858. The railroad company appropriately named the city "Sullivan" after the area's first settlers. Shot 2C: (Narrator) Currently celebrating its 150th anniversary, a series of articles have been recently republished.</p>	
3	<p>Shot 3A: Sesquicentennial Banner Shot 3B: Water Tower</p>	<p>Shot 3A: Background Music Shot 3B: (Narrator) Originally written many years ago for a local newspaper, the author, Bob Cosgrove, reminisces about what life was like in Sullivan growing up in the 1930s</p> <p>Fade Out Cat Briar Road Music</p>	

<p>4</p>	<p>Shot 4A: Red brick house Shot 4B: Side Street fade to street signs Shot 4C: Maple Street</p>	<p>Background Music – Appalachian Sunrise Shot 4A: (“Bob”) When I was growing up in Sullivan the population of the city was around 2000. We lived on the corner of Bell and Elm Streets although we didn’t know it at the time. Shot 4B: (“Bob”) Don’t get me wrong; we knew where we lived, we just didn’t know the street [names]. Everyone at this time got their mail at the Post Office; there was no mail delivery and so no need for addresses as we have them today. Shot 4C: (“Bob”) It was just “over where so-and-so lives” or “three houses down from the Baptist Church”. Everyone seemed to get where they wanted to go with these directions.</p>	
<p>5</p>	<p>Shot 5A: MainStreet1900s.jpg fade to Main Street today Shot 5B: Meramec River (distance) Shot 5C: 3 Meramec River shots</p>	<p>Shot 5A: (“Bob”) Growing up in Sullivan in the 30s was quite different than it is today. [There was only] one ball field [and] we’d never even heard of soccer. When summer came we were looking for a place to go swimming. Shot 5B: (“Bob”) [The Meramec River] is where my brother Tom and I gave swimming lessons to Bob Wessler. Shot 5C: (“Bob”) One of us would get in the water and the other would push Bob off the rock. The one in the water would help Bob to the take out point and we’d start all over again. Bob always was a fast learner and it wasn’t long before he was jumping, swinging, and diving off the rock.</p>	
<p>6</p>	<p>Shot 6A: Fisher Cave Shot 6B: Fisher Cave exterior</p>	<p>Shot 6A: (“Bob”) I spent a lot of time in the [state] park in my early years. In 1937, I was an employee at Fisher Cave. Shot 6B: (“Bob”) The pay was \$3.00 a week for six days [work] and I could have Wednesdays off. I had never seen three whole dollars in one week before.</p>	

<p>7</p>	<p>Shot 7A: Route 66 sign Shot 7B: East Springfield Shot 7C: Gas Pump fade to West Springfield</p> <p>Fade to black</p>	<p>Shot 7A: (“Bob”) When I was growing up in Sullivan, [Route] 66 was a busy, two-lane highway, which was called “The Main Street of the Nation”. Shot 7B: (“Bob”) When it ran through Sullivan it supported some businesses and was practically the North edge of town. Shot 7C: (“Bob”) Almost all the stores had gas pumps. Gas cost around 10 to 15 cents a gallon. They say if you figure in inflation that gas is cheaper today. (Background Music Fade Out) I’m not sure of that and I’m certainly not going to take the time to figure it out.</p>
